Canine Club Offers Area Dog Classes

The Southern Michigan Obedience Training Club, the largest dog-training organization of its kind, will once again offer a course to area dog-owners.

The club, which operates 12 dog schools in the Oakland-Macomb County area, will open a ten week course Monday at Bloomfield Hills High School.

The class will begin at 8 p.m. and is under the supervision of Holly Thornton. The weekly course has been offered at the High School as a part of the Adult Education System.

This Monday will be Demonstration and Registration Day in which all interested residents are urged not to bring their dogs, as instructions will be given.

After the first week, the course continues for the prescribed ten lessons, followed by a graduation with ribbons and trophies awarded to the top four winners in each division.

The course is open to all dogs, although the school prefers the canines to be over six months old. Last year over 850 dogs in the area participated within the 12 weeks.

The organization teaches dogs to heel, stay, come when called and makes them better canine citizens.

Interested area residents can call the high school for further information.

Country Day Shows Speed, But Lacks Weight in Line

Detroit Country Day will field a much faster, but much lighter team this season as the school prepares for its first football game Saturday.

With just seven lettermen returning, new head coach George Brown will have his work cut out for him trying to better the school's 4-4 record a year ago.

Brown replaces Dick Anderson, who has since ventured to Clintonale to take over line duties at the class B school.

As his assistants, Brown will have Phillip Dillman to coach backfield and Carl Sniderman to handle the line.

In the backfield, senior quarter-back Steve Serlin will direct the team's winged-T offense. Only 130 pounds and 5-foot 6-inches tall, Serlin reminds one of Eddie Lee-Baron in stature.

"He's got a good arm and passes well, but he's so short that often times he can't see his targets," Brown said.
