The fair is open to the public, and there will be no charge for admission.

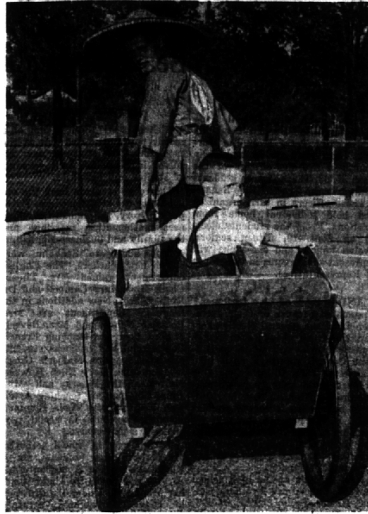

Small children attending the fair will be offered a free ricksha ride, which is part of the Japanese Missions display.

A program featuring a guest speaker will climax each evening's activities. The Reverend Edward Azam, who has just completed three years with a survey team in Beirut, Lebanon, is the speaker Oct. 9.

October 10 features the Rev. E. C. Weber, first vice president of the Michigan District, and Oct. 11 the Rev. David Eberhard from Riverside Church in Detroit, who has been working with the Inner City Mission.

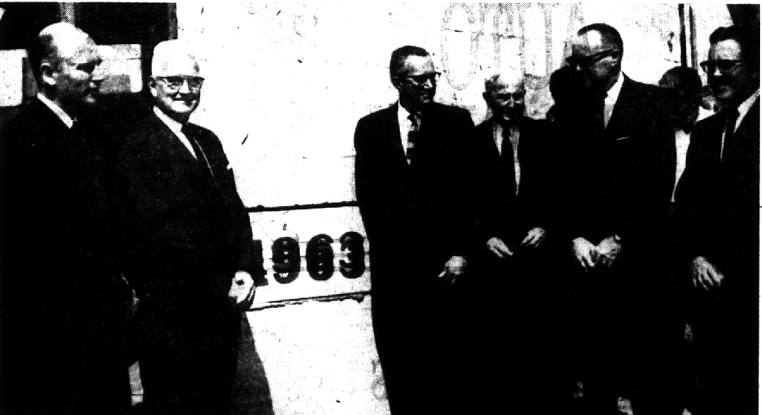
A composer, Mrs. Rogers has had a score of her anthems for choir and organ works published.
