The meeting will be held in the home of Mrs. W. L. Mueller, 30150 Chevrolet Hills Court, Franklin, hostess for the day.

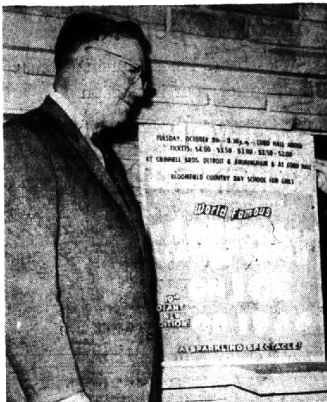
