The class will consist of a lecture period, class workshop and working on individual media. Classes will begin at 8 p.m. and close at 10:30 p.m.

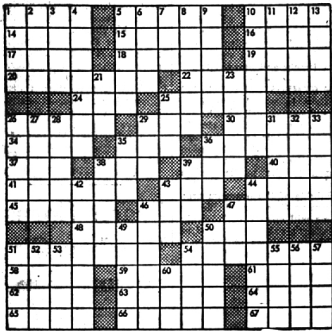

African Art, Handiwork On Exhibition

A double treat is in store for art lovers when two new exhibitions open Oct. 4 in Cranbrook Academy of Art Galleries.

Scheduled to remain up through Oct. 24, the exhibits are "Arts of Africa," circulated by the American Federation of Arts, and the "African Collection" of internationally-famous designer-waiver Jack Lenor Larsen.

The galleries are open daily except Mondays and major holidays from 2 to 5 p.m. There is an admission charge.

"ARTS OF AFRICA" presents 112 handcrafted items in wood, ivory, barkcloth, weaving, matting and netting, basketry, leather, gourds and cocoonant shells, pottery, metals and beads which serve as an introduction to the products of the African craftsman.

An attempt has been made to survey the field geographically and in terms of materials used and the types of objects produced.

LARSEN'S COLLECTION features many outstanding fabrics such as Zanzibar, a flamboyant, large-scale print for upholstery and drapery use; Kano Cloth, derived from Ghana's traditional Kente cloth, a multi-colored weave of spun silk and embroidery floss, and Caravan, patterned from the design on a lion shield, which is handprinted on cotton velvet.

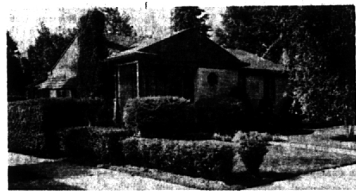

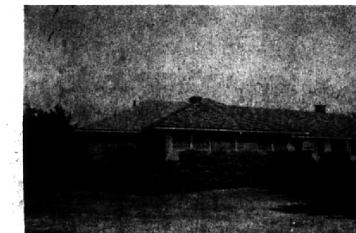

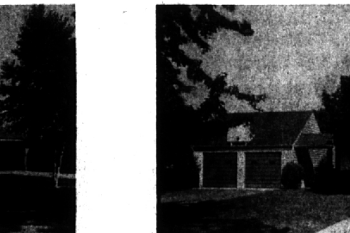
