

Oakland U. Records Jump in Enrollment

Record increases in enrollment at Oakland University were announced by Herbert N. Stoutenburg Jr., registrar and director of admissions. "University officials predict a total of 1,650 students will be enrolled by the time late registrations are completed," he said. This is a 20 per cent increase over last fall's enrollment.

"Approximately 700 new students have enrolled, which represents a 40 per cent increase over last year's class," he said.

CHANCELLOR D. B. Varner said, "Oakland's growth of new students, in addition to being the largest class, is the best class in academic quality in the history of the institution." Oakland is nearly five years old.

'I' Gropes Through Fantasy Repulsed, Drawn by Reality

THE PUMPKIN EATER, by Penelope Mortimer; McGraw-Hill, 1968. New York, N. Y. \$12.95.

Reality can be frightening. Ignoring it can lead to terror. In an extraordinary novel, Penelope Mortimer sketches a tale that portrays just what terror a deliberate turning away from life's unpleasantness can generate.

"THE 'I' of the story is not so much a character as a spirit. She is the spirit which lurks within even the strongest to join with 'I' in her cry.

"I can't believe what is happening. Always there's a voice that says it's not true, people are good, kind, reasonable, loving, all this is just a dream. I won't be made to accept it."

IT BEGAN for 'I' when her schoolmate arrived for a visit. Something was wrong. She sensed

it. She knew it. Her father? Her friend? It seemed best to ignore it. Her friend left. She was relieved without knowing why but felt an unresolvable doubt festering.

Other situations develop. A flirtation. Mistaken intentions. More and more she is drawn toward reality. More confusion.

Then marriage... ones, twice numerous children; how many we are never told except that even the marriage and the children are a means of escape.

FINALLY, a third marriage and reality becomes a brick wall from which there is no escape.

IT'S EMOTIONAL breakdown

and recovery are sketched in vibrant touch 'takes' but with an intense logic.

The style is penetrating and perfectly controlled. It comes across appealingly and forcefully and we sympathize and suffer with her as she painfully gropes her way through a world where she has lost touch with reality.

THE AUTHOR has done a particularly skillful job in creating an atmosphere which keeps the reader drifting around on the same plane as 'I'. Scenes and conversations float in and out of the narrative which suggest rather than tell the story.

The whole effect is rather eerie and frightening but wholly credible.
