## Will-O-Way Goes 'Musical'; Expands Its Teaching Staff

A dancer and two musicians have joined the teaching staff at Will-O-Way Amusement Theatre, for whom she was announced today by Celia Merrill Turner, director. The three will coach the dramatic training school's students in the special musical comedy techniques of dance, singing and accompaniment.

The new instructors are Mary Gardner Pardee (Mrs. Clark E. Jr.), Martha Slaney Welton (Mrs. A. Roger) and Evelyn Falatine. Each will conduct a 30-hour course opening Sept. 30 and ending Feb. 23 at the Amusement Theatre, 775 W. Long Lake Road, Bloomfield Hills.

MRS. PARDEE will coach actors on singing style and delivery, as well as instructing trained vocalists in dramatic arts.

A resident of 4158 Walnut Hill Drive, Birmingham, Mrs. Pardee toured with the road company of the musical "High Button Shoes" during a year-long run in Chicago.

Mrs. Pardee played the lead for two weeks in the absence of star Audrey Meadows, for whom she was understudy.

She is a pianist and is director of three youth choirs at First Presbyterian Church, Birmingham. She was graduated from Eastman School of Music, where she studied voice and piano.

MRS. WELTON will train organists and pianists in the special art of accompanying soloists, choruses and dancers in musicals.

Holder of a master's degree from the Indiana University School of Music, Mrs. Welton studied piano with the noted Hungarian pianist, Dr. Bela Bosormenyi-Nagy.

She is a former resident of Pontiac and recruitment chairman for the Pontiac Symphony Orchestra. Her husband, A. Roger Welton, is flutist with the orchestra and teaches instrumental music at Madison Junior High School in Pontiac.

Both Mrs. Welton and Mrs. Pardee are active in Detroit area musical groups.

MISS FALATINE will teach the special technique of musical theatre choreography. Studies in New York City with June Taylor, Mat Mattox, Ballet Arts and the Ballet Theatre prepared her for her present role as a teacher.

A former pupil of Marjorie Randazzo of Ypsilanti, she has performed at Vanguard Theatre and with the Ann Arbor Civic Ballet.

OTHER MEMBERS of the Will-O-Way teaching staff are Mrs. Susan Plafan, instructor of scenic and costume design; and Tressa Vay Merrill, expert on Shakespearean speech and diction. Associate Director Duane Peck teaches dramatic.
