Rice Whitewashed In League Opener

Brother Rice's football debut in the Catholic Central Division was somewhat tarnished by Detroit Cathedral Sunday as the Birmingham school suffered a 21-0 defeat. Showing virtually no offensive power, the Warriors were held to a mere 60 yards rushing and an incredible zero yards passing. Brother Rice coach Joe Pascuzzi, in his first year at the Catholic school, attributes the setback to a "lack of desire."

"We're hoping that the poor showing was the result of first-

game jitters, but the main difference was only that they wanted to win more than we did." "There were a lot of missed blocking assignments in the line. They were hitting whoever they felt like hitting at the time. I was very disappointed in the way they played," Pascuzzi said. Paul Jagels, the Warrior quarterback, attempted 12 passes, all of which went astray. "Our ends just wouldn't hold on to the ball," Pascuzzi said.

Lakers Score In 2nd Half To Win, 32-19

It took a great deal of effort, but West Bloomfield managed to stay unbeaten this season, as the Lakers were forced to come from behind to beat Holly, 32-19 Friday. The defending co-champs of the Wayne-Oakland League roared back with two last-period touchdowns to put an end to the Bronco's upset hopes. Holly knocked the Lakers back on their heels with three first-half touchdowns to give them a 19-0 lead at the intermission. But the second half was all West Bloomfield as the Lakers scored four times to put the game out of reach.

Holly scored first in the opening period as Mark Phalen scored on a five-yard run and also made the extra point. In the second quarter, Holly struck twice more when quarterback Tom Fagan hit Bill Stark for a 50-yard touchdown and the marred 40 yards to score, with Fagan getting the six points on a one-yard plunge.

The Lakers only mark in the first half came on a 50-yard scoring pass from quarterback Dan Hacht to end Erik Hacht. Hacht, who did another great job directing the team, gave some indication of what was ahead in the second half when he grabbed the kickoff and raced 70 yards to cut the Holly lead to 19-12. Hacht then turned in a fine defensive maneuver as he grabbed a fumble on the following kickoff and sped 50 yards to paydirt. But the conversion failed and the Lakers trailed 19-18. Jay Williams put the Lakers ahead to stay in the final period with a five-yard scoring run, and Grig put a stop to a final Holly threat by intercepting a pass and giving 98 yards to score.
