Accused Rapist Ruled Insane

A panel of three psychiatrists has ruled that a 38-year-old Livonia man, accused of kidnaping and raping a six-year-old Detroit girl in Southfield Aug. 7, is insane.

Norton Silvers, of 32162 Pembroke, Livonia, was arrested the day after the little girl was pulled into a car near her home and driven to a field near Northland shopping center where she was raped and released.

THE CHILD described her attacker and he was later spotted by a gasoline attendant.

Silvers at first denied the crime, then confessed. He has a long record of arrests and served a prison term for a 1951 indecent liberties offense.

Judge Joseph A. Gillis ordered Silvers committed to Ionia for an indefinite term.
