The program for the evening was presented by Oliver Rose. He is assistant principal of Walled

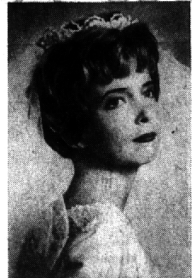
