**Fiction Writing Class Organizes Into Workshop**

Formation of the South Oakland County Writers' Workshop marks the second time that the Division of Continuing Education, Oakland University, Rochester, has had an adult class that meets regularly.

The first time was in 1962 when members of a class in amateur archaeology established the Clinton Valley Chapter of the Michigan Archaeological Society.

The Writers' Workshop has been formed by members of a fall term "Workshop in Fiction Writing" course which opened last month. Membership in the new group is open to all amateur and professional writers in the South Oakland County area.

AN ORGANIZATIONAL meeting for interested writers will be held at 1 p.m. today in the home of Mrs. Lee S. Reese of Pontiac.

At that meeting consideration will be given to holding meetings twice a month, alternating afternoon and evening sessions. This would permit participation on a one-a-month basis for those unable to attend the daytime sessions.

Meetings of the Writers' Workshop will be working sessions devoted to the reading and criticizing of original writing brought to the group by its members.

Mrs. Priscilla Jackson, who instructed the Oakland class forming the group, and has taught creative writing at The Community House, Birmingham, feels that the talents of the members of this particular class auger well for the new Writers' Workshop.

"THERE ARE several extremely promising writers in the founding group who should be able to set a professional standard of writing for the workshop," she said. Mrs. Jackson, a member of the Detroit Women Writers' Club, feels that writers can derive great benefit from mutual criticism and exchange of ideas.

The Clinton Valley Chapter of the Michigan Archaeological Society, like the Writers' Workshop, was the outgrowth of an Oakland University continuing education class.

Now in its second year, this group of amateur archaeologists was formed by 10 students who had taken a course in "American Archaeology for the Amateur" in the spring of 1962. The group

now numbers around 40 members who meet regularly for study and for field trips to excavate promising sites to the Oakland County area.
