

# Birmingham YMCA Teams Outswim 6 District Rivals

The Birmingham YMCA competitive swim teams were victorious in the 1963 annual Christmas swim meet for the Southeastern District, and took nearly all first and second place honors.

On Friday, Dec. 27, the midgelet and prep boys' teams competed in 19 events. Winners of the 80-yard medley relay in the midgelet division, which consists of boys 10 years of age and under, were Fred Green, Dan Green, Dick Quint and John Costello.

The midgelets also came in first in the 80-yard freestyle relay, thanks to the efforts of Therman Dalkymler, Guy Rondot, Scott Love and Fred Westdale.

Coming in first in the 20-yard freestyle and second in the 40-yard freestyle events was midgelet Scott Love. Fred Westdale and Guy Rondot took first and second places in the 80-yard individual medley, and first and second in the 20-yard

butterfly competition were Therman Dalkymler and Mike Mendelson.

DICK QUINT was an untested first in the diving events, and winner of the 20-yard breaststroke was Guy Rondot.

Totalling up, the Birmingham midgelet boys scored 85 points, 54 more than the midgelets of the Fishers YMCA, who came in second with 31.

In the prep division, the 11 and 12-year-old boys who distinguished themselves by racking up five second place ribbons were John Howlett in the 20-yard freestyle, Steve Craig in the 80-yard individual medley and 40-yard freestyle events, Paul Martin in the 40-yard butterfly and Jim Eckberg in the 40-yard breastroke competition.

The 100-yard freestyle winner was John Howlett, who with the aid of teammates Paul Martin, Jim Eckberg and Steve Craig, put Birmingham in second place, in the 160-yard freestyle relay.

The end saw the Birmingham midgelets and preps returning home with a combined total of 132 points. Second place in total points scored was the Northern YMCA, with 79.

ON MONDAY, Dec. 30, the girls of the Birmingham YMCA midgelet and prep teams also did an outstanding job. Ten-year-old Peggy Clark competed in four events, one of which was a relay with Connie Martin, Dorothy Rondot and Wendy Dalkymler, and midgelet Peggy took all first place ribbons.

The midgelet girls scored 84 points to come in first, against second place on the Dearborn Y. The prep girls scored 48.

Twelve-year-old Janet Clark and Cheryl Westdale, 11, of the prep team each swam four separate events and both girls won first place in every event. Linda Costello and Ann Martin also participated in the relay.

The prep girls also took first place in the meet with 85 points. Dearborn placed second with 63 points.

The junior girls and the intermediate boys of the Birmingham Y also romped away with first place honors at the meet.

COACHES OF the Birmingham Y teams are Virgil W. Westdale and Richard Staunton.

The swimmers and their parents plan to meet on Sunday, Jan. 19, at the Birmingham Y for the presentation of the awards as well as a pot luck dinner and movies.

# State Opens County Lakes for Rainbows

More than 240,000 legal and smaller-sized trout were released in 130 of Michigan's inland lakes by the Conservation Department this past fall to provide more sport for fishermen.

Plantings included some 137,000 fish in the "keeper" class and about 103,000 sub-legal trout, including 13,000 splake fingerlings.

Lake, Oxbow Lake, Orchard Lake, Cedar Island Lake, Union Lake, Cemetery Lake, Crooked Lake, Sugden Lake, Graham Lake, Elizabeth Lake and Macey Lake.

Bald Mt. Pond, Horseshoe Lake and Davistown Ponds are the three planted waters not open in Oakland County during the season.
