Trips to Niagara Via Rail Sold Out

Heavy demand for tickets has swelled Michigan Railroad Club's Niagara Club excursion trains to maximum cold weather length of fifteen cars.

The two trips are set for Saturday, Feb. 8, and Sunday, Feb. 9, both originating at Windsor, Ont., and operating via Canadian National Railways.

SATURDAY'S TRIP was sold out Jan. 11, four weeks in advance. Ticket sales for Sunday's trip were stopped a few days later. More than 1,500 persons will ride the trains to see and photograph Niagara Falls in frozen splendor. Those unable to get tickets are urged to send a self-addressed, stamped envelope to the Michigan Railroad Club, P.O. Box 329, Royal Oak 48068, to receive information about any future rail excursions planned. If there's sufficient interest a repeat Niagara Falls trip may be scheduled before winter's end.

Winter Driving Tests Underway

John H. King of 5480 Longmeadow, Birmingham, manager of the motor truck division of the Automobile Manufacturers Association, is taking part in the annual tests of the National Safety Council's committee on winter driving hazards.

The tests are being conducted for two weeks on an ice-covered field at Gaylord, beginning Jan. 20. For the past 21 years the committee has run wintertime tests to evaluate the performance and reliability of various types of tires, tire chains and other equipment, and methods of driving more safely on ice and snow.

KING has participated in the tests in six previous years. The 1964 tests will examine the control and stopping effectiveness of auxiliary emergency braking systems on trucks and school buses.

In addition, they will continue last year's research into the effects on stopping distances of five variables: ice surface, ice temperature, air temperature, wind velocity and direction, and the amount of sunlight.


