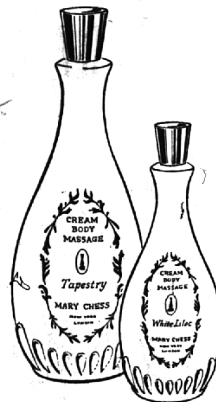
The event will climax Hadassah's annual fund-raising drive to combat eye disease and further medical research in Israel.
