the lower buildings and add to esthetic enjoyment by residents. The proposal would encourage the development of "more campus-like atmosphere," they say.

Wolfenden and Craig oppose the town houses because they feel the structures were proposed to benefit one property owner, Robert Swanson, who owns 25 acres of property he hopes to develop into town house sites.

THEY ALSO contend the city's fire department is not equipped to protect 3-story buildings and that allowing 3-story multiples would discriminate against property owners in the business and office districts.

Lee, Colombo, Beresford, and City Attorney William C. Hartman feel that permitting 4.5 families per acre would be more defensible in the event of a court test than would 3 families per acre. Hartman said he "could not

predict we can defend 4.5 with any greater success." "But we can make it more palatable to property owners," he added. "It's a step in the right direction."

Lee was more definite in his opposition to restricting the population to 3 families per acre.

"OUR PRESENT zoning of 3 families per acre was reasonable and therefore defensible in the courts as long as we had epidemic tank and health problems," he said.

"Now that sewers have eliminated those problems, we fear the courts will hold that a 3-family-per-acre restriction is unreasonable and unconstitutional."

Wolfenden and Craig feel that if the two proposals are incorporated in the ordinance that residents may lose the "rural atmosphere which they moved here for" and could lose control of the city's "election machinery."

putting a modern, 12-cylinder, 300-horsepower engine into a 1909 automobile. Under the new constitution, provisions for general law counties remain largely unchanged. The only change in the provision for the election of officers is that the county of officers is extended from two to four years, and, under fiscal powers, the limitation of a county's indebtedness was increased from 3 percent to 10 percent of its assessed valuation.

HOWEVER, PROVISION was made for a local option charter form of county government (county home rule) as an alternate to the standard form of government provided by the constitution and laws (general law). If the legislature enacts the necessary enabling legislation. Inasmuch as the language of Section 2, Article VII of the new constitution is quite clear, we repeat it here verbatim:

"Any county may frame, adopt, amend or repeal a county charter in a manner and with powers and limitations to be provided by general law, which shall among other things provide for the election of a charter commission. The law may permit the organization of county government in a form different from that set forth in this constitution and shall limit the power of ad valorem property taxation for county purposes and restrict the powers of charter counties to borrow money and contract debts. Each charter county is hereby granted power to levy other taxes for county purposes subject to limitations and prohibitions set forth in this constitution or law. Subject to law, a county charter may authorize the county through its regularly constituted authority to adopt resolutions and ordinances relating to its concerns."

"THE BOARD of supervisors by a majority vote of its members may, and upon petition of five percent of the electors shall, place upon the ballot the question of electing a commission to frame a charter. No county charter shall be adopted, amended or repealed until approved by a majority of electors voting on the question."

"THE RIGHT to have a form of government different from that described by the constitution is structural power. The substantive powers granted by this article, the authority to levy taxes other than the general property tax, the right to adopt resolutions and ordinances relating to its concerns, the right to frame and adopt a charter describing procedure, powers and duties are subject to limitations imposed by general law. That is, the enabling legislation for Section 2, Article VII, to be passed by the state legislature will determine general law for home rule counties."

"THIS GENERAL law will establish a debt limit, or an area thereof, a property tax limit, or an area thereof, and determine what non-property taxes shall be granted or prohibited home rule counties. Thus, we see that the statutory implementation of enabling legislation for county home rule in Michigan becomes the first key to its success or failure. The law may list the powers and duties granted by the home rule provision, or they can avoid any definition of the powers by conferring to home rule counties all powers not delegated to the state by the state constitution."
