

Children's Village Approvals Reach Final Phase: U.S.

A final nod of approval from the federal government is all that's needed before actual ground-breaking begins on the proposed Children's Village for Juvenile Court Agency, who have pledged half of the estimated \$646,000 construction costs.

MARCH 3 IS the date that officials have set to begin construction on the 50-acre Village site at the County Service Center. Two youth cottages and a special service center will be given immediate attention.

Final plans for the initial units were approved recently by the Oakland County Board of Supervisors, now awaiting word from the Housing and Home Finance

They will be completed in December, 1964, while construction of the entire village, intended to solve overcrowded conditions at existing youth facilities and increase the amount of care, will take several years.

State Editors Slate Annual Confab at MSU

A noted cartoonist, an automotive official, an advertising agency executive and a young scientist will speak to Michigan newspapermen at a Michigan State University conference Jan. 31-Feb. 1.

Over 700 editors and their wives, representing the state's more than 350 daily and weekly newspapers, are expected at MSU's Kellogg Center for Continuing Education for the 96th annual meeting of the Michigan Press Association.

VIRGIL PARTCH, creator of the "Big George" cartoon character, will talk on humor in newspapers. Lee Iacocca, Ford Motor Company vice president and Ford Division general manager, will discuss the automobile market and how it affects Michigan.

Whit Hobbs, senior vice president and member of the board of directors of Benton & Bowles, Inc., New York, will concentrate on ways to make newspaper advertising more effective.

Dr. Leroy G. Augenstein, chairman of the MSU Department of Biophysics, will discuss science, ethics and public decisions.

ROUNDING OUT the major speakers are J. Montgomery Curtis, director of the American Press Institute at Columbia University; W. L. Carr, head of the statistical and compiling department at Port Publishing Co., and Kay Savage, food editor of the Detroit Free Press.

Other highlights include a discussion of trade problems, displays of the latest printing and newspaper equipment and of the best advertising ideas of 1963; a cheese smorgasbord, results of the MPA newspaper contest and a tour of a new newspaper plant.
