Water Rates Re-Scheduled By Township

WEST BLOOMFIELD—Despite objections by builders to one of its provisions, an ordinance controlling the operation of water and sewer systems in the township was passed by the West Bloomfield Township Board.

Water rates for residents were also established in anticipation of the township taking over this week the operation of all its well systems previously operated by the Oakland County DPW.

Rates of \$1.50 per 1,000 cubic feet, with a minimum of \$3 per quarter was set. Meter service fees, ranging from \$2.50 for a three-quarter meter, will be charged. Unmetered water lines will have a \$15 per quarter flat rate.

THE BOARD tabled passage of an ordinance governing standards of water and sewer construction until township engineer Tony Altz can complete specification details. Several changes in specifications were made following a meeting of township officials with local builders last month.

Builders' objections to the operations ordinance centered around control of sewage water capacity developed in wells put in by subdivision developers. They wish the developer to retain control over the extra capacity.

The township ordinance recognizes well capacity as the property of the township to be utilized as the township shall determine, with preference given to the original developer of the well.

The township's position was defended by attorney Tom Beaman, who said the township committee appointed to study the objection had heard the arguments made by the developers but felt that the township must have control to say where wells will be dug, what water lines tied together and where capacity could best be used.
