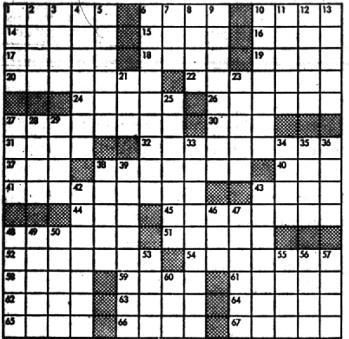

## BRIDGE

in BIRMINGHAM

Many nonvulnerable opponents like to confuse the bidding by making a very weak overall, but what does it do to partnership confidence?

Today's hand was recently played at the Birmingham YMCA and the North and South hands had a difficult time at arriving at the proper contract of three trump, but the weak overall certainly aided John Noreen and Hank Georgia not only to arrive at the proper contract but to get a complete top board.

Most West hands failed to make this foolish overall, and when North made a bid of one spade, South found himself in a difficult position and made a underbid of one no trump and that became the final contract.

Some arrived at a part score in a minor suit, and some went down at game in a minor suit. Had the South hand made a "reverser" of two hearts over the one spade call of his partner—that can arrive at the three no-trump contract. The opening lead was won in the closed hand with the ace of hearts and the jack of spades returned, and the Queen was played from dummy. East did jump in quickly and returned the jack of hearts just to find South with this second stopper of the king of hearts.

Now John was able to win two hearts, three spades and five clubs for one trick over and a score of 950 points and a complete top.

## Great Books Group Seeks New Members

After hearing him speak to Theta Sigma Phi members at the Detroit Press Club last week, we could write six columns about Detroit's Charles Feinberg.

And we guarantee you wouldn't be bored by a line of it. This collector and lover of good literature owns more than 3,000 volumes on Walt Whitman and is a world-recognized authority on the poet.

When he was 17, Charles Feinberg started gathering unto himself written clues to the mysterious genius of great writers. He bought a letter written by Walt Whitman for \$7.50. At the time, the London-born youth was making a weekly salary of \$22.50.

You get some of the feeling of that letter's worth to its 17-year-old owner when you hear Feinberg say:

"... THIS WAS the paper that he had touched... the words that he had written... that he had looked on." The handwritten and typed words of some of our nation's finest writers now belong to the fantastic Feinberg collection. It includes some of the handwritten treasures left behind by Feinberg's late friend Robert Frost. He is a friend to many of the important writers of today — John Ciardi, Marianne Moore and Karl Shapiro among them.

He brought along a few samples from his collection and spread them on a table. The women journalists were intrigued by a 20-page handwritten unpublished manuscript which D. H. Lawrence never finished.

Feinberg gave Potpourri permission to publish the first paragraph, though he says there's a chance we may both go to jail for it.

"TO WRITE THIS sort of thing," said the immortal Mr. Hemingway, "you need a typewriter. To describe, to narrate, to write funny cracks, you need a typewriter; to fake along, to stall, to make light reading, to make a good piece, you need luck, two or more drinks and a typewriter. Gentlemen, there is no typewriter."

That's a perfect place to end, but I must tell you that Feinberg was introduced by TSP President Barbara Marx of the Birmingham Board of Education's public relations department.

Barbara told of first knowing Detroit's famous collector a few years ago when she worked at the main Detroit Public Library and Feinberg was, as he still is, active in the "Friends of..."

**ALL BARBARA DID** was mention her admiration for Hemingway. A few mornings later she arrived at her desk and found a handsome case lying there. She untied three ribbons, pulled out the contents and found herself reading some original Hemingway correspondence with his publisher.

Before she settled down to enjoy reading the treasure, Barbara says, "I rushed down to the rare book room and locked myself in."

The work is "The Imaginary Invalid," and I guarantee it will get a lively presentation by members of the school's Proscenium Club.

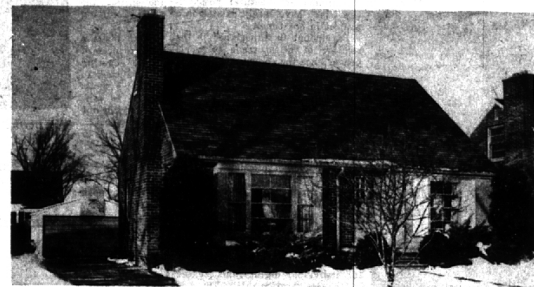

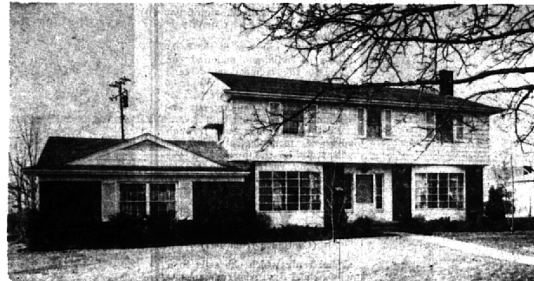
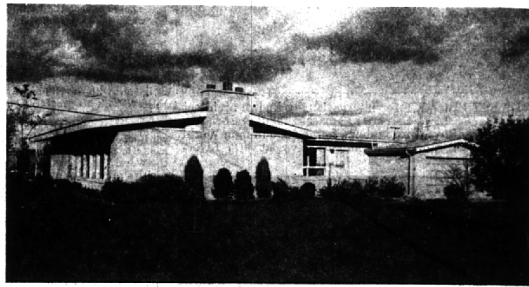
