

First Annual Home Improvement Show Scheduled to Open

The first Annual Water Wonderland Home Improvement Exposition opens its doors to the public at 1 p.m. on Wednesday at Detroit Artillery Armory on West Eight Mile Road near Greenfield.

Sponsored by the Greater Detroit Home Improvement Council, the show will feature some 75 exhibits ranging from mirrors and drapery to statutory fountains and swimming pools. Many new products, processes and materials will be shown. Model improvements for

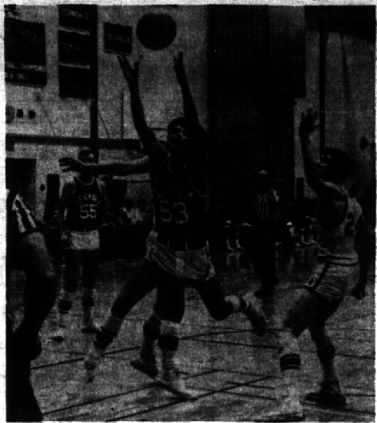
