How does she demonstrate her personal health and fitness through her attitude, habits, appearance and physical well-being?

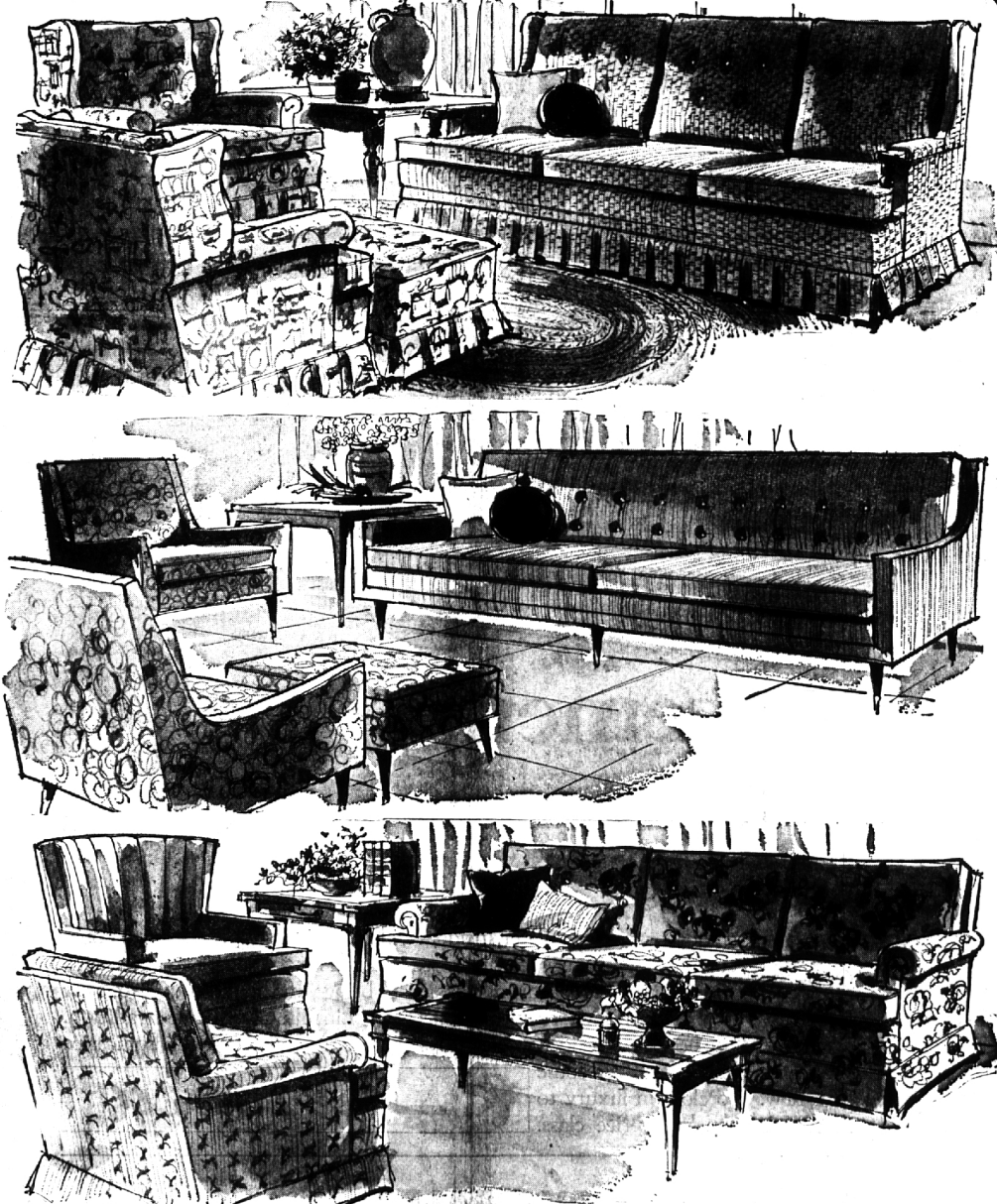
To what extent has she participated in civic and community affairs? Be specific.
