Publicity to the schools in the form of posters, hand bills, tags to be worn, public address announcements and bulletins will help to remind the students of the event.

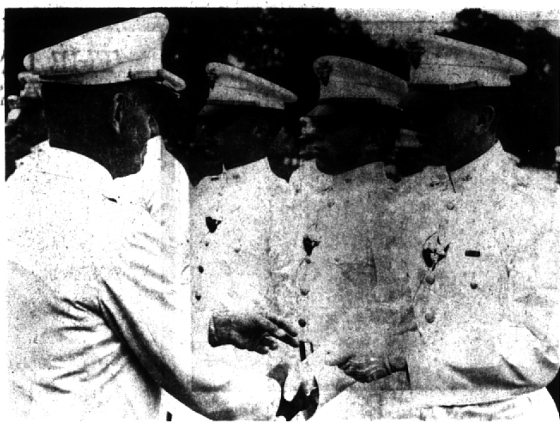
AREA SCHOOLS participating in the event are Seaholm Hills, Groves High, Bloomfield High, West Bloomfield High and St. James Catholic School.

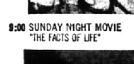
