To help solve the problem, Judge Moore proposed "a well-grounded movement to protect the now fearful and sadly-abused general law-abiding public from crime and law violation, from the unrepressed, intentional and highly protected vicious action of law violators."

HE THEN listed three steps that could be taken:
"We can well afford much more intensive educational programs to train our police officers in the skill of utilizing lawful means of arrest and lawful search and seizure.

"We can arouse the general public to aid law enforcement instead of being passive or even antagonistic.
"We can institute a constitutional amendment, both national and state-wide to permit search of automobiles at reasonable times and with reasonable purpose over and beyond the present rules and for the explicit purpose of greatly retarding the felon's free use of his means of carrying contraband and making his 'get-away."
