doctors prescribe because of its unique construction," said Johnson.

OF COURSE a pipe wouldn't be a pipe without fine tobacco, so a trip to the humidor is in order. Churchill's stocks both domestic and imported blends which are ready-packaged, but Manager Ted Hanke takes greater pride in blending a mixture to suit the individual's taste.

Using 100-year-old brass scales, Hanke's mixes and measures a variety of blends, which might include Latakia from Syria or Perique

from New Orleans. Hanke formerly was in charge of the tobacco department at the Detroit Athletic Club.

The shop also offers pipe polishing as a gratis service, and will repair pipes within 10 days.

For the pipe smoker who is already well-stocked in the basics, Churchill's also carries accessories such as pouches, racks, removers and humidors.

AN INTERESTING item has its own built-in willpower. Called the Mono-Smoke, it's a cigarette case which is locked and timed to open only at preset intervals.

Although Churchill's has set itself up as a quality tobacco shop, they take great pride in one of their customers: an old-fashioned plug cutter which measures out a nickel chew!

70 Teens Attend First Y Dance

The dances will be supervised by YMCA personnel, music will be by combos and records and the dress-casual. Admission price has been set at 50 cents.

The next dance will be held on Oct. 17 and will be sponsored by Derby Junior High School.

City to Experiment With Street Parking

The City of Birmingham is going to experiment with restricted parking on Forest Avenue east of Hunter Blvd.

Commissioners Monday night authorized the police department to install signs along Forest between Adams and Elm limiting parking to two hours on both sides of the street during the daylight hours.

In addition, no parking will be permitted between 8 a.m. and 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. and 7 p.m. on one side of the street. Police Chief Ralph W. Moxley will conduct a survey to determine on which side of the street parking will be prohibited.

All of the parking restrictions will be on a 90-day trial basis before becoming a part of the Birmingham Traffic Code.




