Businessman to Speak To Kirk Men's Club

Ernest D. Nathan, senior staff consultant with Florez Inc., Detroit-based sales manpower development agency, will be the guest speaker at the first fall meeting of the Kirk in the Hills Men's Club to be held in the Undercroft at 7:30 p.m. Monday.

Chairman of seminars in sales manpower development conducted by the Florez organization at Oakland University and a member of the Kirk, Nathan will speak on "A New Way to Enjoy the Bible." He will illustrate his talk with color slides of the Kirk's stained glass clerestory windows.

Episcopal Churchwomen Will Meet at St. James

Churchwomen from many area churches will converge on Birmingham at St. James Episcopal Church hosts the Grand River Convocation of Episcopal Churchwomen.

The day will begin at 9:30 a.m. with registration in the Narthex. Holy Communion will be celebrated at 10 a.m. in the Chapel of the Holy Spirit, by the Rev. Kenneth H. Gass, rector of St. James and dean of the Grand River Convocation.

The pre-luncheon speaker will be Mrs. Richard Wood, Convocation Christian Social Relations chairman, who will discuss the Cranbrook Conference.

FOLLOWING luncheon at 12:30, a color motion picture, "The Great Land," will be shown. The movie shows the missionary work being done in the state of Alaska, which should be of special interest at this time to St. James women, following the recent visit of Rev. Walter Hamann from Alaska.

All women of the parish are invited to attend. Reservations may be made by calling the church office not later than Friday. Nursery service will be provided.

The churchwomen will have an afternoon meeting at the Oct. 21 meeting, the Rev. Richard Cockrell, assistant minister at St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, Ann Arbor.

Rev. Cockrell is chairman of the Episcopal Diocese Committee on Alcoholism and Alcohol Education, and will speak on the role of the sponsor and the employer in helping an alcoholic face up to himself and seek help.

HAVING RECENTLY been appointed executive secretary of the Washtenaw County Committee on Alcoholism, a volunteer agency, Mr. Cockrell helps operate a referral center for alcoholics and their families. The center is staffed by seven volunteer psychiatrists and 30 social workers and is located in the Episcopal Church in Ann Arbor.

Rev. Cockrell's address will follow luncheon in the Undercroft of the church, and all interested persons are invited to attend. Luncheon reservations may be made by calling the church office.

Two parishioners from St. James will attend the Triennial Convocation of the Episcopal Church being held in St. Louis, Mo., from Oct. 11-20. Miss Josephine Kelly, former church school secretary at St. James, will represent the Girls Friendly Society of the National Church. Miss Kelsey is presently an advisor for Girls Friendly.

MRS. GLENN Gilbert, vice president of the Episcopal Churchwomen of the Diocese of Michigan, will attend the convention as a delegate. The theme of the convention is "Mutual Responsibility and Interdependence in the Body of Christ."

One of the main tasks before the convention will be the election of a new presiding bishop of the Episcopal Church in the U. S. A.

These social evenings are designed to acquaint friends of the church with other participants in their area and to promote discussion of liberal religion.

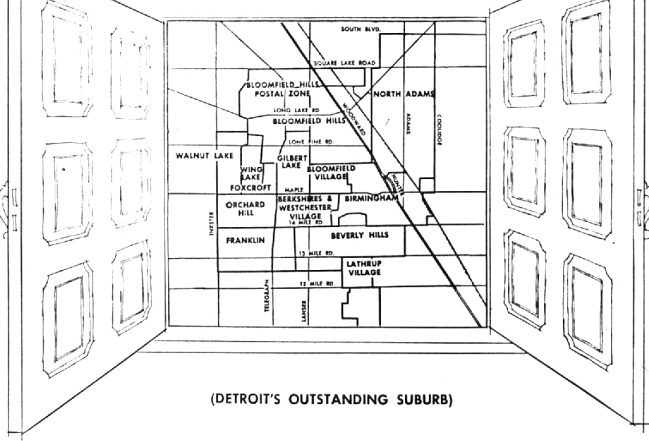
