# Europe Adventure Highlight of Summer

Nine reels of movies and 400 slides and snapshots were taken in Europe this summer by Gay Marie Kelly of Beverly Hills and the Frank Balnaves family, former residents of Birmingham who now live in Wilton, Conn.

Gay, the daughter of the James Kellys of Auburn House, and Fran Balnaves, attended Groves High School together and Gay was thrilled by the invitation to accompany the family abroad.

The trip, of which every detail was planned three months in advance by Mr. Balnaves, began on Aug. 27 when the S.S. America sailed from New York, docking at Southampton, England, on the Fourth of July.

Their last city in Italy was Milan, from which they traveled over the Alps into Switzerland. Stopping at Lausanne long enough to take in the exposition, they went on to Geneva where they encountered the worst weather of the trip. However, this didn't prevent them from taking a cable car to the top of Mt. Blanc where they left the storm below under the clouds.

From Geneva, they drove back into France stopping along the way at Dijon, Fontainebleau, and Caen. At this point they stopped for three days, taking side trips to St. Michel and the Normandy beaches.

THEIR LAST two days on the continent were spent at the port of LeHavre then seven more days on the S.S. America, a trip through customs, and their trip was officially over, but not for Gay who went on to Connecticut with the Balnaves before returning to Beverly Hills late last month.

The films won't be Gay's only mementoes of the summer, as she kept a faithful record in her diary, and has a charm from each country for her bracelet. Gay is now beginning her freshman year at Grand Valley State College near Grand Rapids.

THE GROUP went directly to London where they spent several days visiting such places as the Tower of London, Westminster Abbey, Parliament, Buckingham Palace, Madame Tussaud's Wax Museum, Piccadilly Circus, and the British Museum.

Driving to Edinburgh, Scotland, where they spent two days sight-seeing, and Aberdeen, where the Balnaves visited relatives, they then returned to London by way of Liverpool for more sightseeing and shopping.

On July 19 they flew to France and fell in love with Paris where they spent four days taking in everything from the Louvre to the Latin Quarter. Touring through France they stopped to see the Palace of Versailles and the Cathedral of Chartres before crossing the Pyrenees by train to Madrid.

THERE THEY visited the Plaza Market and the Prado Museum where Gay especially enjoyed the works of El Greco, Goya and Brueghel. After a side trip to Toledo, they took a sleeper to Barcelona where they saw their first bullfight before returning to France and the Riviera at Juan Les Pins.

The French Riviera was just as the girls had pictured it and they spent five days sunning, swimming, and shopping before driving to Italy where they stayed at Portofino and visited Pisa and Genoa before heading for Rome.

In Rome they saw the Vatican, attended Mass at St. Peter's, threw three coins in the Fountain of Trevi, stopped at the Coliseum and the Roman Forum, and saw Aida at an open-air opera.

TRAVELING To Sorrento, they took two one day side trips to Pompeii and the Isle of Capri before motoring to Florence via the Analfi Drive. Arriving on Aug. 22, they spent three days viewing the museums, markets, and Medici Palace, and at their next stop, Venice, they toured the city in a gondola.
