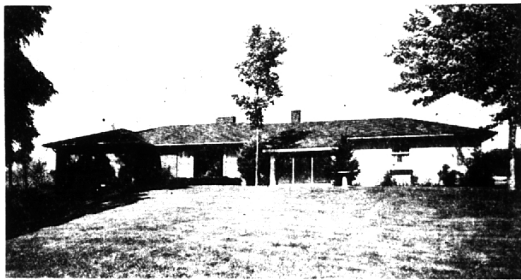

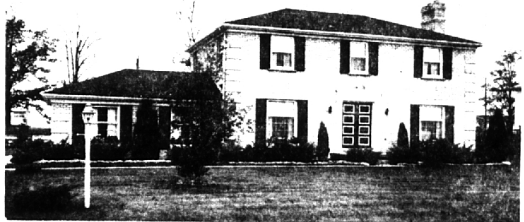

The Clinton Valley Chapter of the Michigan Archaeological Society will host a statewide workshop on archaeology at Oakland University from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Sunday for anyone interested in archaeology or the American Indian.

Two years ago a group of amateur archaeologists from the Oakland County area joined to form the Clinton Valley Chapter, the newest chapter of the state society. Donald R. Harger, M.D., of Birmingham, is president of the local chapter.

LEONARD Griffin, of Pontiac, president-elect of the Michigan Archaeological Society, is chairman of the all-day workshop.

Participants will include: Dr. Olaf Prafer of Case Institute of Technology; Drs. James Griffin and James Fitting of the University of Michigan; W. D. Frankforter of the Grand Rapids Public Museum; Tony Spina of Birmingham; Detroit photographer; Richard Allan, Rochester architect, and other authorities in the field of archaeology.

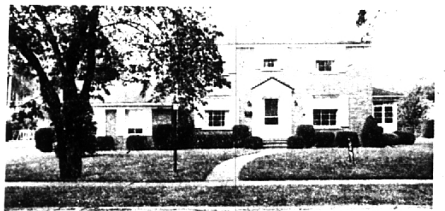
