**YOUR GARDEN CENTER**  
**FALL FACTS!!**

The frost is on the pumpkin and if you are a bumpkin—forget the following. If you live in the suburban or "yard owning" crowd, the following may be useful to you—especially if you moved here from California, Hawaii, Alaska, Texas or from an apartment.

**ALPHABETICAL ASSISTANCE:**  
 Act immediately to acquire spring flowering bulbs such as TULIPS, DAFFODILS, CROCUS, etc.

Be sure to water young trees and shrubs and especially evergreens until the ground is frozen 2 or 3 inches deep. Then MULCH with MARSH HAY or PEAT MOSS.

Collect your hose and sprinkling equipment and drain it and store it for the winter.

Dig dahlias—do not pull them up by their necks. Broken neck tubers will not grow. Store clumps upside down in a dry cellar.

Exactly right time to divide and replant peonies. Never forget that they need 1/2 pound of Bone Meal for each year of age of the plant. Exciting, isn't it?

For roses, a bit of bone meal is most helpful to the plant next year if you put it on this fall. Sort of like a Christmas Savings Plan.

Good practice is to mow the average lawn 1 1/2" to 1 1/4" through the last season. When you put the mower away set it up to two inches for all of NEXT YEAR'S mowing.

Have you dug your Parsnips and Oyster plants? I hope not—but if you like them you should do it now. UGH!!

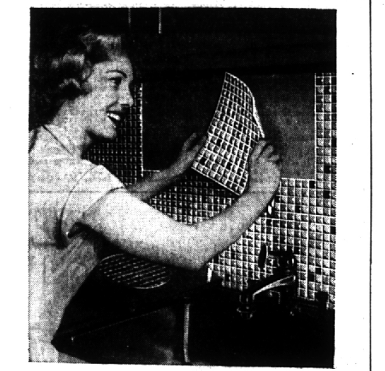
