Spartans Defeat Tigers In B'ham-B'field Loop

The Spartans remained unbeaten in the varsity conference of the Birmingham - Bloomfield Football League Friday by blanking the Tigers, 12-0, on a first period and last period touchdown.

In the opening quarter, Andy Gordon pounced on a fumble at the Tigers' 30 and Dave Forrester led the Spartans to a touchdown with Jack Harrick going the final three yards.

After strong defensive play by Spartans Jay Hozan, Ken Schack and Pat Connelly kept the Tigers bottled up in the third quarter, Harrick scored an insurance TD in the final period by racing 60 yards to paydirt.

THE HAWKEYES scored in every period to register their second win in the junior varsity loop, by downing the Badgers, 27-12, Saturday.

George Stephens opened the scoring when he went 11 yards off tackle in the first quarter and Kevin Thornhill scored from four

yards out in the second period. Steve Shell added the PAT to make it 13-0 at halftime.

BUT JOHN CARGILL plunged five yards and Shell made his third PAT to give the Hawkeyes a 27-12 victory.

The Wildcats scored all their touchdowns in the first half and went on to lead the Badgers, 20-0. Jash Jaroszewicz scored on the opening kickoff, going 65 yards, and then raced 65 yards from when the junior varsity loop, scrambling to add another.

Mark Dunkle set up the final TD in the second quarter when he went 50 yards to the Buckeye five. John Roberts took it in. Rick Stein and Rick Wolfe led the winners defensively.
