### School Superintendents Set Political Confabs

School superintendents of the county will move into a new educational role in the next two weeks.

They will sponsor candidates' night meetings on October 14 and October 27 for prospective members of the State Board of Education.

Dr. Dana P. Whitmer, president of the Oakland County Association of School Superintendents and superintendent of Pontiac Schools, said that the Democratic slate of eight candidates appeared at Pontiac Northern High School on Wednesday, Oct. 14.

The Republican candidates will be presented at 8 p.m. on Tuesday, Oct. 27.

EACH CANDIDATE will be introduced and given five to eight minutes for discussion of his views

of the role of the new State Board of Education in public education in Michigan.

A question and answer session and coffee period will follow.

The new Constitution grants the State Board leadership and general supervision over all public education, except institutions which grant degrees. The previous board had authority only over teacher training institutions. The new board will also serve as the general planning and coordinating body for all public education, including higher education, and shall advise the legislature on the financial needs of these institutions.

THE BOARD WILL also appoint the state superintendent of public instruction, who was formerly elected.

School board members, school administrators and P.T.A. members have been specifically invited, Whitmer said. Other interested persons are welcome.

The Democratic nominees who appeared Wednesday included Thomas J. Brennan, Dr. Leon F. Hill, Miss Marilyn Jean Kelly, the Rev. Charles E. Morton, Dr. Edwin L. Novak, Dr. Peter Oppewall and Donald M. H. Thauber.

The Republican candidates are Alvin M. Bentley, James F. O'Neil, Robert Briggs, John Kregger, Bourke Ladewyck, Mrs. Julian Hatton, Miss Ellen Schommonson and Mrs. James Parker.

The Republican meeting of October 27 will also be held at Pontiac Northern High School at 8 p.m.

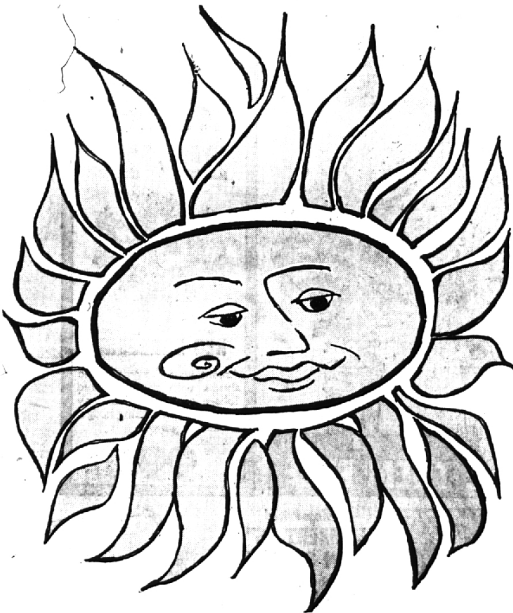
