 April, and a 17-month period for actual construction of the high school complex.
 The school board has been reluctant to okay preliminary drawings for the new structure while there is still a possibility that the Lahser Road site cannot be used.
 The basic programming suggested by MacMahon will include educational specifications only and can be used for any alternate site in the event that the Lahser Road property is permanently blocked by a court decree.
 THE SUIT was lodged several months ago by a group of property owners near the proposed site who contend that Lahser Road is not sufficient to carry additional traffic that would be generated by the high school.
 The plaintiffs also seek a determination of who has jurisdiction of the road and its maintenance.
 Revised plans for additions at Hickory Grove, Conant and Bloomfield Hills Junior High School were also approved by the school board.
 MacMahon SAID bids on the "package" would be due Nov. 12 and that the board will be able to consider awarding a contract at the next regular meeting.
 The package includes a larger library, three new classrooms and a second kindergarten for Hickory Grove; six new classrooms for Conant; and four additional classrooms at the junior high school.
 Preliminary plans for an elementary school on Square Lake Road near Squirrel were presented by Henry Haberkorn of O'Hell, Hewlett and Luckenbach, architects, and were approved by the school board.
 PLANNED ARE 12 classrooms (with intercommunication at each grade level) work rooms for each grade, two kindergartens, a library center, a large multipurpose room and a kitchen.
 In the future the school could be enlarged by adding six classrooms and an activities room.
 In other business, the board: • Authorized the printing of an 88-page handbook now being prepared by the Birmingham-Bloomfield League of Women Voters. The handbook, slated for completion by Dec. 1, will be divided into three parts and will explain the workings of the school district, the school system and financing school operation.
 The LWV handbook will replace the school board's annual report this year.
 • Discussed the proposed lowering of speed limits in front of Conant and Booth schools. The board agreed there is a related problem in the fact that many children walk along the shoulders of heavily-traveled streets on their way to school.
 Trustee Max Miller said the board should consider building a path, or sidewalk, on school property near Conant and Bloomfield Hills Junior High to alleviate the problem.

Bronson Calls For Study of County Crime
 S. Jerome Bronson, Democratic candidate for Oakland County Prosecuting Attorney, said Tuesday evening at the Birmingham Community House that if elected he would immediately name a special fact-finding citizens committee to report on "the rising crime rate and increasing lawlessness in Oakland County."
 He said the citizens committee would be represented by "civic leadership in Oakland County." They would come from every city, village and town and meet with county law enforcement officials, school administrators and educators, youth agency officials and county clergymen and make concrete recommendations which he would act to solve on a county-wide basis growing acts of lawlessness.
 "THESE ACTS of lawlessness must be met by leadership from the chief law enforcement officer in the county—the prosecuting attorney—and each and every member of his staff," Bronson said.
 "ACTS of lawlessness must be met on all levels of government and the chief duty of the prosecuting attorney is to support the leadership necessary to fight and overcome this growing crime wave."
 Bronson cited in support of his position national statistics showing an increase of 15 per cent in serious crime in the first six months of 1964 over the comparative period of 1963. The same statistics show crime in the suburbs to have increased 23 per cent in the same period.
 "Leadership must be supplied to combat growing lawlessness. I will supply that leadership."

 initiative and referendum proposition, as approved unanimously by the commission, is limited to ordinances adopted under the provision of the City of Birmingham Charter.
 "It is the intent of the commission to deal with legislative matters by such ordinances," he said.
 THE CONSENSUS of the League was to support the commission if ordinances would cover legislative matters and resolutions administrative matters only.
 Mrs. Margaret Essary, chairman of the LWV's 1 and R study committee, said her group "could see no reason for not accepting the proposal of the commission."
 The LWV decided to oppose Walker's amendment because it felt it was too broad.
 The membership instructed Mrs. Essary to write a letter to the commission commending it on the proposal.
 In a separate action, the League passed along to its progress planning committee a suggestion that the LWV undertake a study on the possibility of revising Birmingham's charter.
 The charter has never been revised since the incorporation of the city in 1933.
