Church Youths to Canvass For Annual UNICEF Drive

On Sunday afternoon, more than 300 young people from the Birmingham churches will trick or treat not for Halloween, but for UNICEF, the United Nations' Children's Fund.

Under the auspices of the Birmingham churches, plans have been made to conduct the annual UNICEF drive from 2 to 5 p.m. the Sunday before Halloween.

Groups of youngsters will go from door to door under adult supervision. The Sunday prior to Halloween was chosen because young people from the churches could meet more readily and cover their areas during the daylight hours.

The young people will be identified by their official collection cartons, a half-pint milk container printed in orange and black with the UNICEF symbol of the mother and child.

In addition, each youth will have a UNICEF identification tag.

Only such goodwill ambassadors are authorized to accept money for the Children's Fund.

The young people will meet at the First Methodist Church at 2 p.m. for instructions and a short dedication service. The Rev. Carl Price will give the service.

Churches working on the program include First Baptist, First Methodist, Congregational, First Presbyterian, Franklin Community and St. James Episcopal.

OTHER GROUPS wishing to share in the project may call Rev. Bill Cecil at the First Presbyterian Church for an area of assignment.

"Each dollar contributed to UNICEF can mean a daily glass of milk for 17 hungry children for a whole month or the vaccine to protect 100 children from tetanus," said Rev. William W. Sutterlin, publicity chairman.

UNICEF is the world's largest international agency working on behalf of children. Established in 1946, it is currently giving assist-
