Highlighting the evening will be the announcement of the Regalia Ball Queen. The girls will be judged on beauty, intelligence and school spirit.

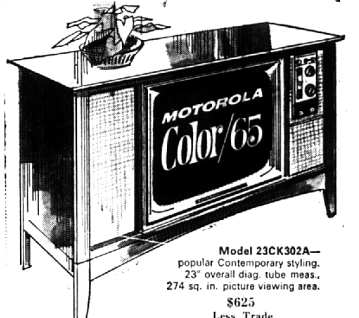
Burgundy and gold lights will focus on Ross Mulholland's professional five-piece band. Tickets will cost \$2.50 per couple.
