YOUR GARDEN CLINIC OCTOBER OBSERVATIONS

1. You are flirting with losses if you have not put all your liquid garden chemicals into warm (over 32°) storage for the winter. Freezing spoils many. You should now your grass shorter from now on so that when it stops growing it will not be over 1 1/2" tall. If the grasses are much taller they may mat and be in BAD shape in spring.
2. Yes, it is too late to apply grass seed and much too late to fertilize. The seed would be wasted and the fertilizer would be damaging.
3. Clean up and burn your vegetable garden debris as it could be a haven for CORN BORENS.
4. DO NOT ALLOW leaves to remain on the grass when winter sets in. They are very damaging. Don't you KNOW THIS?
5. This is the PERFECT time to plant your SPRING FLOWERING BULBS. The roots will grow for 5 or 6 weeks but the tops will make small progress. This is ideal. Be sure some BONE MEAL underlies the bulbs.

In the spring one looks up the hose to a sprinkler and an hour later brings the sprinkler in for repair. "Hm! Nothing but spider egg masses. Two bucks gone in a flash. Stuff a bit of Kleenex in all open ends to prevent this wild expenditure of repair money.
