### President



L. B. JOHNSON  
Democrat

Lyndon Baines Johnson is the Democratic candidate for the office of President. Johnson, 54, became President last November after the assassination of John F. Kennedy.

The former vice president has been in politics since 1932 when he left his native Texas to go to Washington as secretary to a Lone Star State Representative in Congress.

IN 1937 when a vacancy occurred in the Texas delegation to the House, Johnson defeated nine other candidates after campaigning as an enthusiastic supporter of the New Deal policies of President Franklin D. Roosevelt.

He remained in the House until his election to the Senate in 1948. In 1951 he was elected Democratic whip in the Senate and in 1955 he became majority leader.

Johnson married Claudia Taylor on Nov. 17, 1934. The Johnsons are the parents of two daughters, Lynda Bird and Luci Baines.



H. H. HUMPHREY  
Democrat

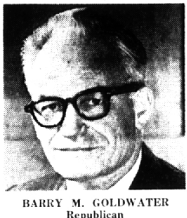
THE SENIOR Senator from Minnesota, Hubert Horatio Humphrey is the vice presidential candidate of the Democratic party.

Humphrey, 55, is a former mayor of Minneapolis. He was elected to the Senate in 1948 and re-elected again in 1954 and 1960. Humphrey was elected Senate Majority Whip in 1961.

Married to the former Muriel Buck of Brown, South Dakota in 1936, the Humphreys have three sons and one daughter.

In 1958 Humphrey became the first American official to meet at length with Nikita Khrushchev in the Soviet Union. The meeting lasted for eight hours and 25 minutes.

Born in Wallace, South Dakota, Humphrey graduated from the University of Minnesota and Louisiana State University.



BARRY M. GOLDWATER  
Republican

Barry M. Goldwater, 55, is the Republican candidate for president. Born in Phoenix, Ariz., Goldwater took over management of the family department store at the age of 27 and introduced profit-sharing and the five-day week into the business.

He was elected to the U.S. Senate in 1952 and re-elected again in 1958.

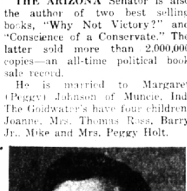
Goldwater is the ranking Republican on the Senate Labor and Public Welfare Committee. He is a member of the Senate Armed Services Committee and its key preparedness subcommittee.

A former Major General in the U.S. Air Force, Goldwater flew cargo across the "hump" from India to China during World War II.

He is also a qualified jet pilot and flew over 8,000 hours flying time in jets and conventional aircraft.

THE ARIZONA Senator is also the author of two best-selling books, "Why Not Victory?" and "Consensus of a Conservative." The latter sold more than 2,000,000 copies—an all-time political book sale record.

He is married to Margaret (Peggy) Johnson of Munich, Ind. The Goldwaters have four children: Joanne, Mrs. Thomas R. Barry Jr., Mike and Mrs. Peggy Holt.



WM. MILLER  
Republican

WILLIAM MILLER, 59, of Lockport, N.Y., is the GOP candidate for vice president.

The son of a factory janitor and milliner, Miller worked his way through Notre Dame and graduated from Albany Law School.

He practiced law for four years in Lockport before entering the service. In 1945 he acted as assistant prosecutor at the Nuremberg trials under Robert Jackson.

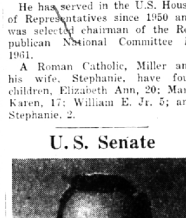
He has held the post of Justice of the Peace in both the city and township of Farmington from 1951 through the present. He has served as Republican candidate for the Michigan Justices Association and the Oakland County Judicial Association, and is a member of the Southfield Optimist and the American Legion. He is unmarried.

James Clarkson, 39, 28255 Valley View, Southfield, received his L.L.B. degree from the Detroit College of Law. He served as state representative in 1959-60 and the mayor of Southfield in 1961-64. Other civic activities include the Southfield Board of Health, Oakland Child Guidance Clinic and the Southfield Optimist. He is a partner in a law firm in Berkley. He is married with children.

JOHN E. MCGRATH, 39, of Pontiac, has served as justice of the peace in Waterford Township from 1961 to the present. An attorney, he received his degree from the University of Denver and Michigan State University. His civic activities include first president, Highland Homes Improvement Association, president, Lakeland Optimist Club of Waterford, a member of the Youth Assistance Committee of Waterford Township, the Michigan State and Oakland County Bar Association, Oakland County Bar Association, and Lt. Governor of Zone Eight, Optimist International.

Unopposed for the unexpired term of probate judge judge through November, 31, 1964 is Norman B. Barnard, 50, of Troy. He is also a candidate for a full term, effective on Jan. 1, 1965 at a salary of \$23,500.

Barnard, an attorney, is currently the probate judge on appointment by Gov. Romney in February, 1963.



WM. BROMFIELD  
Republican

18th Cong. District  
Royal Oak Republican William S. Bromfield is seeking his fifth term in the U.S. House of Representatives in 1964.

Bromfield, 42, is the ranking Republican of the House Foreign Affairs Committee, senior Republican on Energy and National Security subcommittees and member of the Africa subcommittee.

Elected to the State House of Representatives in 1948, Bromfield later became the youngest speaker pro tem in the history of the state.

A former Birmingham resident Philip A. Hart is seeking his second term in the U.S. Senate. Born in Bryn Mawr, Pa., Hart began his political career in 1948 when he became a Democratic precinct chairman in Bloomfield Hills.

In 1954 he was elected Lt. Governor to Governor Williams and was re-elected in 1956.

Hart, 51, has been in the Senate since 1958. A graduate of the University of Michigan Law School he has served as a United States District Attorney and as a Legal Advisor to Gov. Williams.

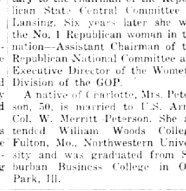


FRANK SIERAWSKI  
Democrat

Frank J. Sierawski, 40, is the Democratic candidate for the 15th district seat. Sierawski is a former assistant secretary of state in the U.S. Department of State.

A graduate of Michigan State University and the Detroit College of Law, Kuhn, 39, is a former delegate to the Constitutional Convention.

Billie S. Farman, the current state Auditor General is the Democratic candidate in the 19th, Farmington Woods, and Detroit. A former deputy state chairman of the Michigan Democratic Party. He is also a former assistant secretary of state.



ELY M. PETERSON  
Republican

IN 1958 Ely Peterson was secretary to the chairman of the Republican State Central Committee in Lansing. Six years later she was the No. 1 Republican woman in the nation—Assistant Chairman of the Republican National Committee and Executive Director of the Women's Division of the GOP.

A native of Charlotte, Mrs. Peterson, 50, is married to U.S. Army Col. W. Merritt Peterson. She attended Williams Woods College, Fulton, Mo., Northwestern University, and was graduated from Suburban Business College in Oak Park, Ill.

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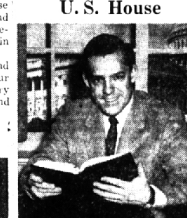
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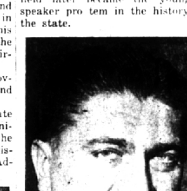

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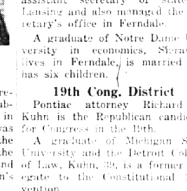


NEIL STAEBLER  
Democrat

A life-long resident of Ann Arbor, Neil Staebler is the Democratic candidate for the office of governor.

Currently Michigan's Congressman-Large, Staebler began his political career in the early 20's when he helped his father's successful campaign for the job of mayor of Ann Arbor.

He was appointed Democratic State Finance Director in 1939 and became the State Chairman in 1950. Staebler has also been a



WM. MILLIKEN  
Republican

A NATIVE of Traverse City, William Milliken is the GOP candidate for lieutenant governor.

Milliken, 52, is a graduate of Yale University and a recipient of the U.S. Army Air Force in World War II. He was awarded the Purple Heart, two Oak Leaf Branches and three battle stars.

President of J. W. Milliken, Inc., Dept. Stores in Traverse City, he has been a member of the State Senate since 1950.

He was elected Senate majority floor leader in January 1963. Milliken is a member of the senate



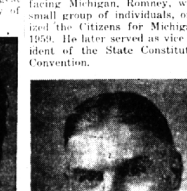
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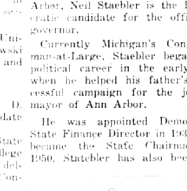


R. A. DERENGOWSKI

Derengowski makes his home in East Lansing.



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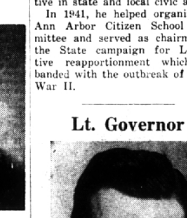
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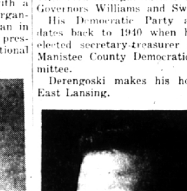
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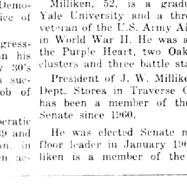


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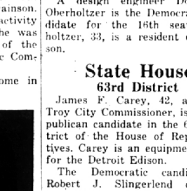
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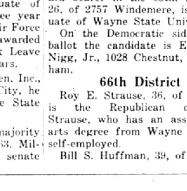


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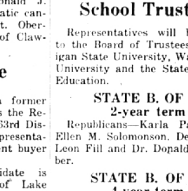
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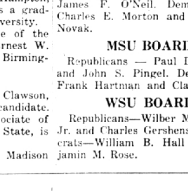


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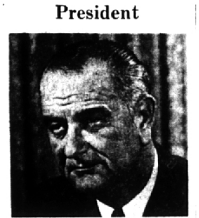
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
