**Dems Honor Candidate in 18th District**

A routing group of more than 700 Democrats met Oct. 12 at the Northwood Inn to give Frank Sierawski an enthusiastic boost in his race for the 18th district congressional seat.

The occasion was the 18th District's tenth annual dinner. Politicians attending to laud Sierawski, were Senator Philip A. Hart, who began his career in this country six years ago; Secretary of State James Hare, Lieutenant Governor candidate Robert Derenzowski, Oakland County chairman Sander Levin, and attorney General Frank Kelley.

Suprise guest of the evening was U. S. Senator William P. Rogers, who said that he was "happy to see the enthusiasm because we have struggled with Oakland County for a long time to resuscitate a Republican congressman with a Democratic Congress."

SIERAWSKI BRIEFLY spoke to the group which included residents from Oak Park, Berkeley, Birmingham, Bloomfield Hills, Southfield, Royal Oak and Huntington Woods.

"Where but in America can a man named Sierawski represent all you people," he said.

- MADE DECENT HOUSING available to more than 14,000 low-income families, many of them elderly;
- Provided more than 110 million dollars in urban renewal grants;
- Provided 35 million dollars in 150 grants to help communities build water and sewer systems and

THE COUNCIL Conservation award is one of 12 such awards made annually by the U. S. Agriculture Department to the more than 500 local Boy Scout councils across America. It marked the first time that the Detroit area council had earned the recognition.

It may come as a surprise to those not close to the Scouting scene that the conservation practices of "big city" Scouts could enable the council to qualify for such an honor.

Perhaps least surprised of all were Camp Rangers Sidney O. Stephens and Frank Powell, who manage the 640-acre Charles Howell Scout Reservation at Brighton and the 1450-acre D-A Scout Ranch near Metamora.

Among the many hundreds of conservation "good turn" projects performed by Scouts and leaders this past year at local council camps, state and private camping properties, were tree plantings, soil conservation through erosion control, water conservation and stream clean-ups, wildlife conservation through feeding and constructing shelters, birdhouse projects, the construction of nature trails and emergency service as fire fighters.
