If you don't think they're complex, you will after reading this. The best way to approach this job is to visualize the following:

You and your wife are turning into your driveway at night in the car, are struck by a hit-run driver. Your car is knocked against the side of your house, explodes, and the house burns. You and your wife die in the tragedy.

THIS IS a bizarre situation, you are sure it can never happen to you, just as you're sure nothing else can, but it is a good one to emphasize the need to have your affairs in order.

Should the above situation happen to you, somebody would want to know at once whom to notify; where your money is; and your life insurance, fire insurance, and car insurance; and who's going to pay for the funeral.

HOW, IN your case, would they find out?

So important have personal papers become in the life, and death, of today's citizen that one of the gravest obligations of the man who retires is to see that they are in order. Here's a list that will help you with the job:

1. WRITE AN information sheet, in duplicate, telling whom to notify in case of unexpected tragedy to you and your wife; and where your money and valuable papers are kept. One copy can be kept in the home. The other should be outside the home, preferably in the files of your lawyer.

2. PUT IN A safety deposit box, preferably, or in a fireproof, burglar-proof container at home. Wills of yourself and wife.

All life, home, car, and other insurance policies. All stocks, bonds, and other certificates of investments.
