He lives with his wife Bernice and three children at 31339 Pierce.



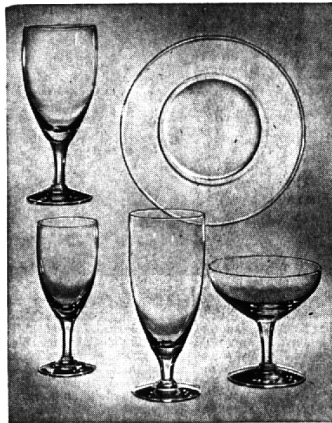
## GMI Alumni

c. entertaining the family, d. housekeeping

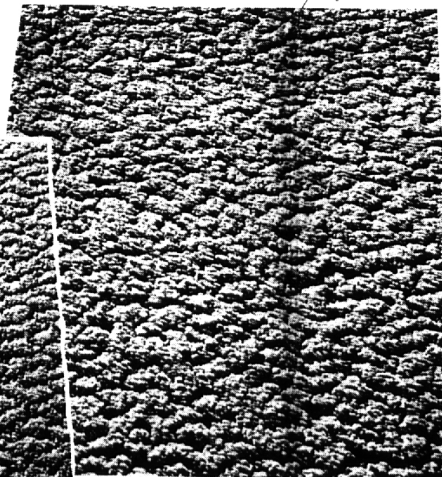
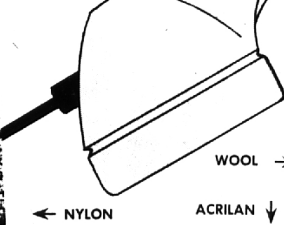
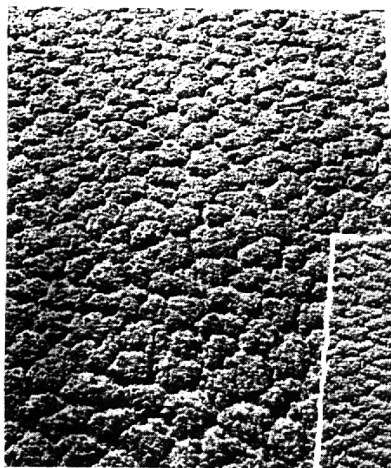
