Read the Whole Book, Says B'ham Minister

To the Editor: In the Oct. 8 issue of The Eccentric you published a letter of complaint concerning the book "None Dare Call It Treason," by John Stormer. The writer of that letter objected to Mr. Stormer's assertion that modernism among American theologians has had a detrimental influence upon the youth of our land and has warped American concepts of right and wrong.

Is the writer of the above-mentioned letter oblivious to the thinking of modernists in regard to this matter? For years the leader of the modernist movement in America was Dr. Harry Emerson Fosdick.

In his book "Successful Christian Living," p. 161, Dr. Fosdick said: "The modernistic movement, adjusting itself to a mass-oriented culture, has encouraged this mood, watered down the thought of the Divine, and may be forgiven for this. LEFT SOULS STAMMING, LIKE THE ANCIENT ATHENIANS, BEFORE THE ALTAR TO AN UNKNOWN GOD." (Capitalization is mine.)

D. R. DAVIES, a chastened liberal, in his book ("The Two Humanities," preface) refers to the "peril of self-enslaving the course of him who trusteth in man." He says, "I have no hope whatever in unregenerate human nature. None! None!" Such are the confessions of two noted liberals—yet the

illustrious writer of the above-mentioned letter is shocked that conservative Bible believers would make such an allegation and then substantiate it.

It is essential to note accurately what John Stormer says. On p. 131, CONTRIBUTED to the general breakdown of moral standard in our society . . . (Capitalization is mine). Surely every thinking American must accept this allegation when it is confirmed even by those who are theologically liberal!

FINALLY, reference is made to Mr. Stormer's attack on the RSV of the Bible. Doubtless the illustrious letter writer to The Eccentric who questions facetiously the mental acumen of Mr. Stormer in relation to the interpretation of Isaiah 7:14, has failed to realize that Matt. 1:23 is but a quotation of Isaiah 7:14.

Thus, if interpretation is to be not, Isaiah 7:14 is to be quoted literally in Matt. 1:23. The failure at this point rests not with Mr. Stormer, but with the translators of the RSV.

At this point it is interesting to note, too, that no definite refutation could be made of the claim that 30 per cent of the translators of the RSV Bible supported communist causes. The writer merely refers

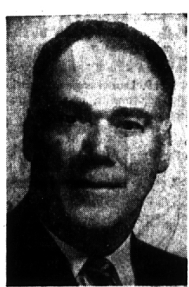
to this statement as "questionable" but he does not attempt an answer! No answer is possible! The facts are substantiated!

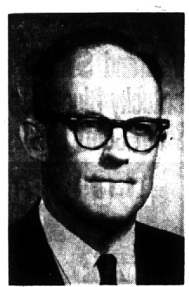

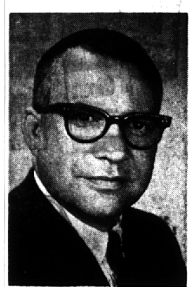

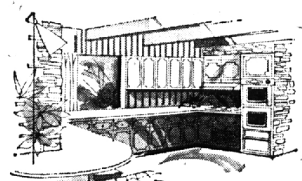
