Groves Slates Mock Election For Presidential Candidates

A mock election for President and Vice President of the United States is being held at Groves High School on Oct. 28 and 29. This election is being conducted by the social studies dept. All students in grades 10 through 12 are welcome to participate.

This election is unique to Groves in two ways, first because a voting machine is being used, and secondly because after the popular votes are tabulated an electoral college will vote upon the final decision.

Each social studies course represents a "state." In a national election each state has the same number of electors as it has Senators and Representatives for Congress. Our "states" have two Senators and one Representative for each 15 students.

THE ELECTORAL college will cast its votes based on the result of the popular vote on Nov. 2 and the final results of Groves mock election will be announced Nov. 3, the day of the national election.

On Monday, Oct. 26, an assembly was held to inform the student body of the issues in the current presidential campaign, the

platforms of the two major parties and to present material on the parties history. Students participating in this assembly were Dan Hastings, J. D. Bartleson, Kay Heideman and Craig Lewis, Ed Republicans and Debbie Chapin, Ed Buyer, Doug Jardine and Barry Barnett for the Democrats.

A movie "Happiness To You," explaining the areas of assistance from the United Foundation was shown to Homeroom Student Council representatives. On Oct. 22 the drive to collect money for the United Fund began in all classrooms.

This year the Dramatics Club will present the play "Curious Savage" on Thursday, Nov. 5, Friday, Nov. 6, and Saturday, Nov. 7 at 8 p.m. in the Groves Little Theatre.

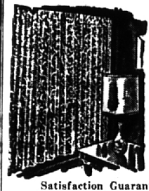

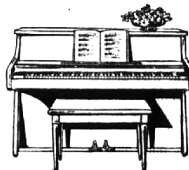
