Educators to Assemble For Barnum Program

Learning with a capital "L" will be in the spotlight Nov. 12 at Barnum Junior High when some 20 outstanding educators of the nation, state, county and city meet with Barnum parents in informal discussion groups to discuss the entire subject of learning.

Preparations for the program on the evening of Nov. 12—named appropriately "Learning to Learn"—were advanced this week when the Barnum PTA program committee met at the home of Mr. and Mrs. James R. Loughran, 547 Hanna.

Mrs. Loughran is a member of the program steering committee, along with Barnum principal Roy E. Vannette, Mrs. O. J. Freiwald, Barnum teacher, Miss Muriel Brusie, Mrs. Richard Pearce and Frank Allen, PTA members.

"THE WEEK IN" which Nov. 12 falls is National Education Week," said Vannette, "and we felt our most appropriate contribution would be a program built around learning. Our objective is to provide all the parents of our Barnum students an opportunity to discuss with leading educators just what learning is all about."

Vannette emphasized that the committee was planning the program in each of the discussion groups around a good deal of parent participation.

"The structure of the discussion groups will give parents the very best opportunity to get down-to-earth answers to their questions together with the viewpoints of experts."

In revealing some of the plans of the program committee, Vannette said, "We're fortunate to have as our keynote speaker Dr. Morton Botel, assistant superintendent of schools in Bucks County, Pa."

"We'll also have with us Dr. John E. Tirrell, newly appointed president of the new Oakland Community College; Dr. Harry Hahn, Oakland County director of instruction; Dr. John B. Smith, Birmingham superintendent of schools; and Daniel A. Nesbitt, Birmingham deputy superintendent of instruction."

"LEARNING TO LEARN" is an idea unique to Birmingham schools and perhaps to Michigan, Vannette pointed out. Barnum mothers and fathers who take part will be "pioneering parents" in every sense of the word, he said.

Others serving on the "Learning to Learn" PTA program committee are: Barnum assistant principal Charles Beyette, Mr. and Mrs. M. Rosenberger, Abbott Gilbey, Mrs. Arthur Burleigh, Mrs. Russell Sloan, Mrs. B. J. Theodoroff and James Maguire.

Juniors Top Seniors in Powder-Puff

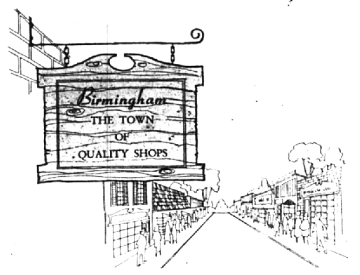


