**Name Five Residents To New Commission**

Five local men are on the 15 member county commission to solicit funds and coordinate programs under the new poverty bill, the Economic Opportunity Act of 1964. The commission will be called the Oakland County Commission on Economic Opportunity.

Named were Carl F. Ingraham, vice-chairman, 240 Harmon; John Mellon, treasurer, 642 Pilgrim; Robert Kilpatrick, 183 Hupp Cross; Leonard Lewis, 1450 Pilgrim and Horace E. Sheldon, 3560 Wooddale. Daniel T. Murphy, chairman of the board of auditors, heads the commission formed to avoid a fragmented approach for antipovertry funds.

Mrs. Blaiam is the teacher-sponsor.

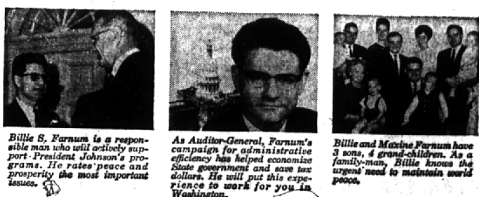
