pheral route or ring road that would divert traffic from the center of the downtown area. The route encloses the area bounded by Oakland, Willis, Chester, Brown, Forest and Brownell.

REID SAID he had delayed taking the survey during the summer months because school was not in session and many people were out of town.

"We selected Thursday because it was felt it was an average traffic day," Reid said.

Along with representatives of Computer Associates, Reid will have 20 teams of surveyors in the downtown area.

"They will record license numbers of cars entering the central business district at principal entry points and points of departure, by 15-minute intervals from 7 a.m. to 11:15 a.m. and 3 p.m. and 7:15 p.m. so the path of through traffic may be determined," Reid said.

HE ESTIMATED that 40,000 license plates would be checked during the day. The surveyors will have no personal contact with motorists.

"With the point of entry and departure of cars known, it is possible to assign their path to any suggested street pattern and to

## Trinity Director Visits High Schools

W. Howie Muir, director of admissions at Trinity College, Hartford, Conn., will be visiting schools in the Birmingham-Grosse Pointe area November 9 to talk to graduating seniors interested in applying to a liberal arts college.

Trinity, founded in 1823 for men of all faiths, is Connecticut's second oldest college and offers degrees in the liberal arts and sciences.

Muir will be at Detroit Country Day School, Birmingham, at 8:30 a.m. and Cranbrook School, Bloomfield Hills, at 10:15 a.m.

"Any car that remains within the CBD for more than 15 minutes will be considered as having terminated its trip and will be counted in a separate parking survey."

"WE WILL record license numbers of parked cars in both the morning and afternoon.

"It will be possible to evaluate the importance of streets leading from point of entry to various parking lots," Reid said.

The results of the survey will then be tabulated by the computer firm.

"Data received from the computer will be expanded to equal the full day travel pattern," he said.

If the weather is bad today, the survey will be conducted Friday.

## Survey Shows What Detroiters Miss in Strike

As the Detroit newspaper strike nears its fourth month, MacManus, John & Adams, Inc., a national advertising agency based in Bloomfield Hills, surveyed Detroiters as to what features of their newspapers they missed most.

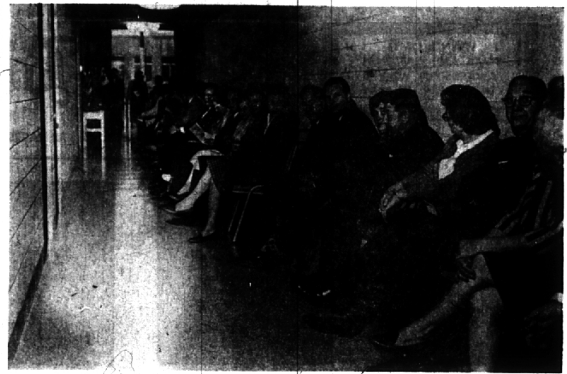
Ernest A. Jones, agency president, reported the results were:

Sports pages were missed most by the majority of men surveyed, followed in order by local and national news, advertising, comics, classified ads, obituaries, editorials, stock market reports and women's section (by 5 per cent of the surveyed males) and columnists (1 per cent).

Sixty-five per cent of the women listed the women's section as most missed, followed by local and national news, advertising, classified ads, obituaries and the entertainment pages.

Fourteen per cent missed the comics most and 2 per cent the stock reports. Comics drew columnists 14 per cent to 6 per cent and 12 per cent of the ladies chose the sports pages as most missed.
