For the first time, because of the new constitution, the Democrats were again the winner on both the state and county levels.

Secretary of State James M. Hare, Democrat, soundly defeated his Republican opponent, Allison Green. Hare's winning margin was over 700,000 votes.

Attorney General Frank Kelly was also an easy victor over Republican Meyer Warshawsky. With more than 90 per cent of the returns in, Kelly held a better than 3-million vote lead.

THE DEMOCRATS also claimed a sweep in the six contests for the various terms on the state board of education.

For the two-year term, Dr. Donald M. Bruner and Leon Hill defeated Republicans Karla Parker and Ellen M. Solomonson.

For the four-year term, Democrats Carmen L. DeLiquadri and Marilyn Jean Kelly defeated Republicans Joyce Hatton and Boukie Lodowyk.

For the six-year term, Thomas J. Brennan and Peter Oppewill were winners over Robert P. Briggs and John C. Kreyer.

For the eight-year term, Charles E. Morton and Edwin L. Novak downed Alvin M. Bentley and James P. O'Neil.

IN THE CONTEST for the Michigan State Board of Trustees, Frank Hartman and Clair White, Democrats, defeated Republicans Paul D. Bagwell and John S. Pingel.

William B. Hall and Benjamin M. Rose were successful over Wilber M. Brucker, Jr., and Charles Gershenson in the race for two seats on the Wayne State University Board of Governors.

In the Birmingham-Bloomfield area, the Republican candidates for the education posts all had commanding leads over the Democrats.
