Eagle Scout Award Tops Court of Honor

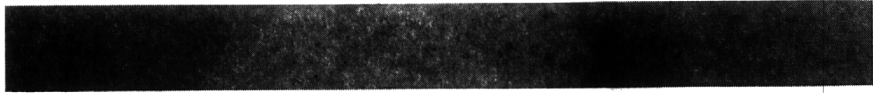
