Seaholm Contributes \$977 To United Foundation Drive

Mr. Thumser and Mr. Van Draegt of the Mathematics Department spent several weeks calculating each Senior's grade point average, consisting of grades compiled over three years of high school. Each average was checked and rechecked to assure accuracy.

The final averages will be announced at the end of fifth marking period when the valedictorian and salutatorian will be announced.

Surpassing last year's amount by \$400, Seaholm contributed \$977.88 for the United Foundation Torch Drive for 1964. This year the drive was sponsored by Student Congress and headed by Scott Bradley. It mainly concentrated on 100 per cent contribution throughout the entire school rather than on the amount of individual amounts donated.

Thirteen homerooms reached the 100 per cent goal. A total of \$78,111 was contributed by the homerooms. \$50 was donated by Proscenium, \$20 from the cheerleaders and \$110.57 was contributed at the Torch Drive film shown in the Little Theater.

In order to successfully promote the drive, students from Mrs. Cortwright's and Mr. Baggs's

speech classes were selected to deliver speeches to each homeroom, explaining the importance and the purpose behind this national organization.

THE "PURPLE PUMPKIN" Seaholm's annual Halloween dance was quite successful. The dance, which was sponsored by the community, was held in the Maple Room Oct. 31. Students danced to the music of the Del Rays and were also entertained by the Suburban Jug Band.
