## Cranbrook Seniors In Honor Courses

Nineteen Cranbrook seniors are members this year of Mr. Carl G. Wonnberger's special English class.

Each year Mr. Wonnberger, head of Cranbrook's English Department, chooses for special English those students who he feels are best qualified in English aptitude and achievement.

Scholastic Aptitude Test scores, National Merit qualifying scores, previous English grades, writing awards, and teacher's recommendations are all considered in the selection of the class.

After mid-year exams each student talks to the class for several days on his topic, and by May completes a thesis covering the same material in more detail.

During class for the first semester, Mr. Wonnberger lectures on semantics and philosophy. By reading and studying independently, special English students are preparing especially well for college study.

In addition to writing the regular weekly themes, the boys each choose an individual field of interest, in which they read intensively.

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A FEW Cranbrook seniors also have the opportunity to take an advanced mathematics course, called math 7, taught by Mr. Frank Gerard, head of the school's Mathematics Department.

Members of this year's class are Dave Craig, Pete Elliott, Dave Gilbert, Bob Hampson, Bob Helms, Dick Moon and Eric Muirhead.

Math 7 consists of an introduction to calculus and analytic geometry. It is about the equivalent of a first year college course.

Students in math 7 must have previously completed two years of algebra, a year of plane geometry, a half year of trigonometry, and a half year of college algebra.

They must also have scored at least in the high 600's on the mathematics section of the Scholastic Aptitude Test.
