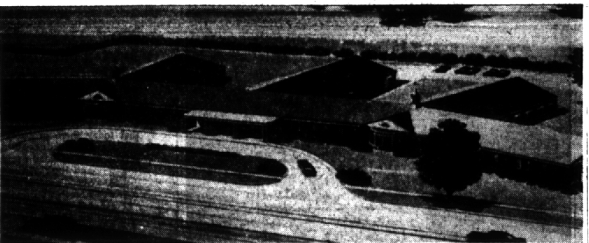
Hills Church Holds Annual Singpiration

ST. ANNE'S MEAD is to be non-sectarian and will be open to men and women, 65 years of age and over, who are in good mental and physical health.

Sponsored by the Episcopal Diocese of Michigan, St. Anne's Mead was organized and incorporated in 1957 under the direction of Suffragan Bishop Archie H. Crowley and is governed by a Diocesan appointed board of trustees headed by Harold G. Demeter of Dearborn.

Area officers include: Mrs. George H. Cary, vice president, Bloomfield Hills; Mrs. Wm. F. Angell, secretary, Bloomfield Hills; George V. Reed, treasurer, Birmingham.

Local trustees are Dr. John B. Ryan, Southfield; The Rt. Rev. Archie H. Crowley, Birmingham; Mrs. Harry C. Dumville, Bloomfield Hills; Miss Cecile Hitchcock, Birmingham; Spencer D. Hopkins, Bloomfield Hills; and Henry A. Houston, Birmingham.

Others are Mrs. Norman James, Bloomfield Hills; Ralph W. Moore, Birmingham; The Rev. Herbert G. Myers, Southfield; Mrs. Sheldon R. Noble, Birmingham; Dr. Fletcher Plant, Birmingham; Garland Tate, Birmingham; and Mrs. Urban U. Woodhouse, Birmingham.

Architectural plans drawn by R. S. Gerganoff, A.I.A., of Ypsilanti, call for complete ground floor construction of brick and consists of a slightly curved central building with attached wings at the rear forming two U-shaped patios designed for recreational use by the residents.

Accommodations for about 55 persons in single rooms with bath, a central dining room and lounge, smaller "snack rooms", hobby shop, spare for hair dressing equipment and a special prayer room will all be included in the original structure.
