Dr. and Mrs. Frank Cellars of Rock Spring Drive and children, Doug and Jane, are looking forward to the arrival of grandmother this week end.

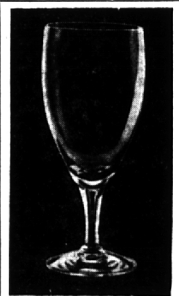
Grandmother is Mrs. Frank Cellar, Sr., of St. Petersburg, Fla. who is making this just one of her stops on a tour of visiting.
