The only rural adult exchange program in existence, it was inaugurated to promote friendship and understanding between peoples in 1950.

Most of the delegates are in college at the time of the exchange, and must have been leaders of 4-H groups. It is a two-way exchange program, and Michigan farm families have been hosts to many foreign IFYE's.

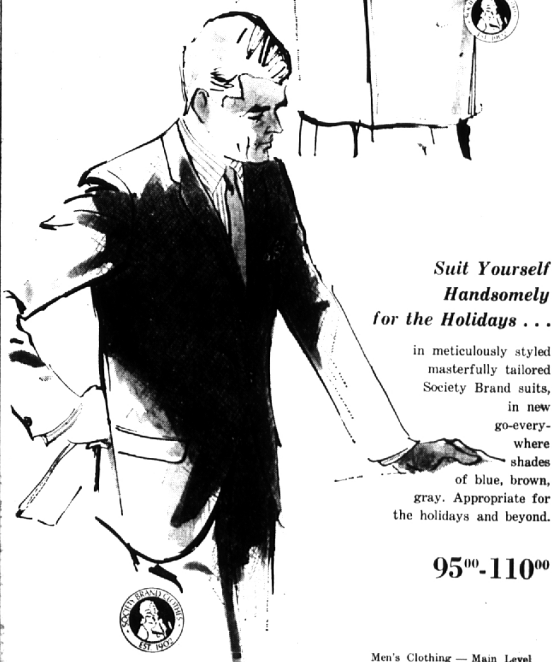
