Dedicate Sculpture To Children's Friend

Children of Franklin school participated Friday morning in the dedication of a playground sculpture they had donated in memory of a lost friend, Mrs. Ted (Gloria Sonneborn) Kelter, Jr., who died last December.

Mrs. Kelter, herself a mother of six children, had devoted much of her time to Franklin young people. She served as vice president of the Franklin P.T.A., organized the Junior Great Books program locally and participated in Scouts and other community youth projects.

She had studied art and ceramics extensively and at one time taught art in Royal Oak.

Because of Mrs. Kelter's image as an extraordinary friend to the children, combined with the artistic facet of her character, the memorial committee chose an original playground sculpture to perpetuate her memory.

MRS. WILLIAM Kahn, Mrs. Richard Bernard and Mrs. Richard Kern handled the details and commissioned James Miller of South Lyons to create the art work. Contributions were received from the student body and friends.

The school children and faculty members assembled on the playground Friday to hear Mrs. Kahn speak a few words for the dedication and Lloyd Van Buskirk, a Franklin resident with the Birmingham school system, make the acceptance. Members of the Kelter family and friends were on hand.

KELTER REPLIED to the dedication with this poem which he had composed for the occasion: "Children are truth plain and simple.

Children are questioning minds
Children are filled with doing
Children are laughter and joy
Children are hope eternal.
Let us all remember to always
be a little like children."

"Bye, Bye Birdie" will be presented Nov. 27, 28, and Dec. 4, 5 and 6 at Bentley High School in Livonia.

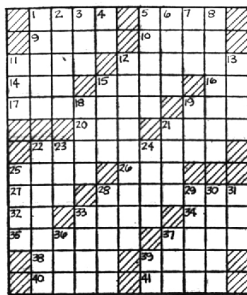

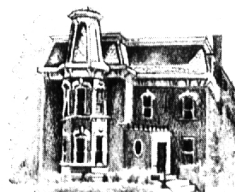

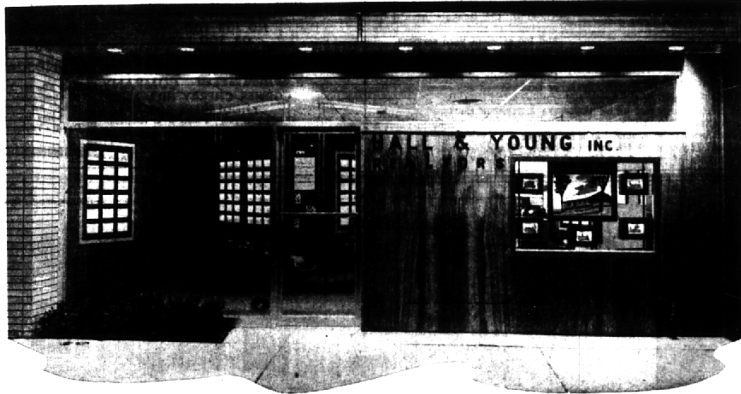
