

Film Lecturer Offers 'Portraits of Mexico'

The characteristics of Spanish-speaking countries will come alive on The Community House movie screen at 8 p.m. Nov. 20-21. Curt Nagel, narrator, is presenting his color film, "Portraits of Mexico," as the second feature in the Travel Film Series.

Nagel, a native Bostonian, became associated with the then new Technicolor Corp., located in his home town, and worked on many pioneer films of that process. He has produced more than 65 theatrical color films for Education Films, Inc., Paramount and 20th Century Fox and was producer of "Tabu," which won an Academy Award.

AS A COLOR-cinematographer, Nagel turned from theatrical productions to the illustrated travel lecture platform, and in this capacity

ity, he has circled the globe. Nagel's "Colorlogies" have become a highlight on major lecture series from coast to coast.

The Community House (Bates & Townsend in Birmingham) again is planning a prefilm dinner to be served both nights of the film showing, beginning at 6 p.m.

Pick Contractor For Dormitory

A Dearborn firm, A. Z. Shmina & Sons, will be the general contractor for Oakland University's fifth student residence, according to Robert W. Swanson, director of business affairs at OU, Rochester.

The firm submitted a low bid of \$308,000 for the contract. According to Swanson, the total project budget, which includes supplemental equipment and site work, totals \$300,000.

THE DORMITORY, which will house 200 students, will be built on the same plan as the recently completed Hill House and will be located adjacent to it. Architects for both dorms were Meath, Kessler & Associates, Grosse Pointe.

Construction will begin immediately, and completion is scheduled for fall 1965 occupancy.

Museum Presents Birmingham Man at Collectors' Series

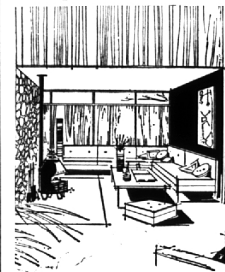

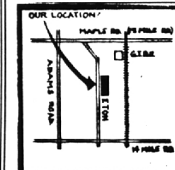

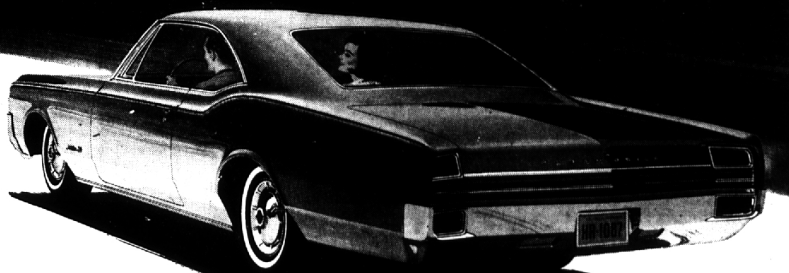
